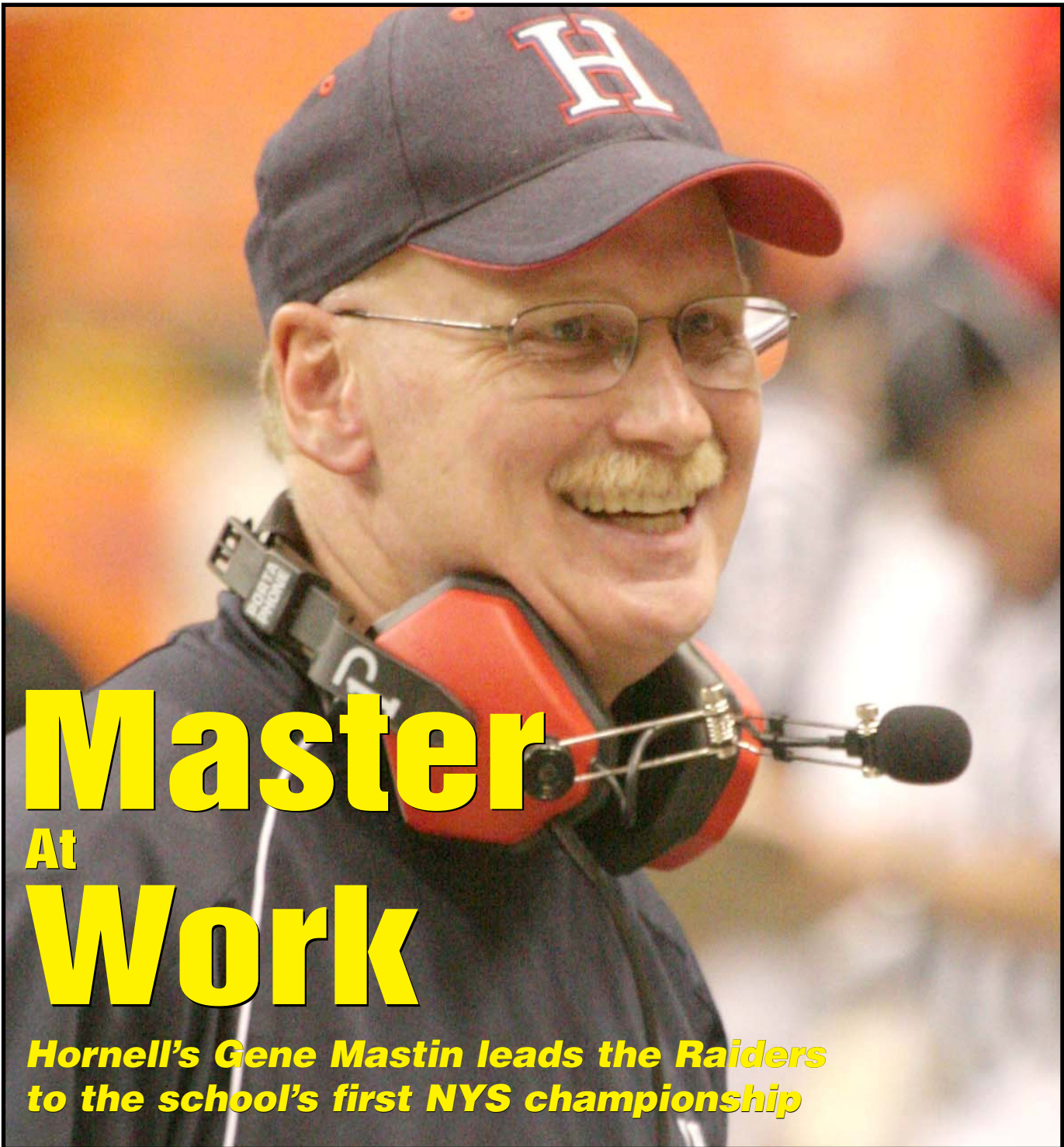

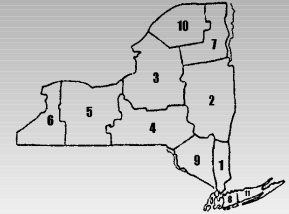

Master at Work

Hornell's Gene Mastin wins first NYS championship

Hornell won the NYS Class B championship when the Raiders beat Nanuet 16-14 in the Carrier Dome on Thanksgiving weekend.

It was the first NYS title for Hornell and head coach Gene Mastin, who took over the program in 1983.

During the post-game awards ceremony, Mastin looked at one of his assistant coaches and said, "Can you believe this? After all these years?"

Mastin can be forgiven if he felt a bit incredulous.

"Until you actually get to the final game and win, it's something that's hard to comprehend," he said.

Hornell has been very good for a long time. Under Mastin's leadership the Raiders have played in 16 Section 5 title games, winning nine.

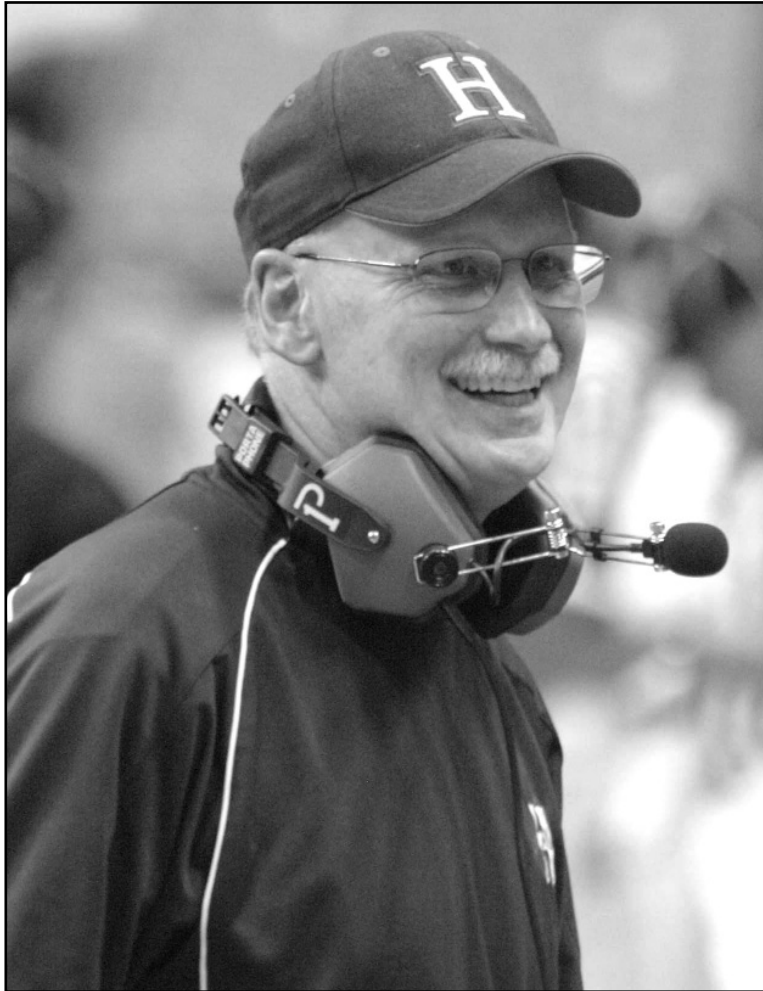
But they had never reached the Carrier Dome, always bumping into someone else's dynasty.

"We've had our toe in the water for a long time," Mastin said. "There were times that I wondered if we would ever get to the final."

From 1997 until 2000, Hornell won four straight Section 5 titles... and each time lost in the Regional round to Section 6 Lackawanna, a team that was in the midst of a 38-game winning streak.

"Those were great teams," Mastin said. "Lackawanna played for the state title every one of those years."

In 2004 and 2005 Hornell lost in the NYS semifinals to power Chenango Forks, a team that played for five

titles in seven seasons.

The 2005 loss was particularly agonizing.

"We missed a 23-yard FG with :21 to play," Mastin said. "We've had to live with that loss for quite a while."

Mastin says that, this season, he tried to downplay the state tournament.

"We didn't really focus on the state tournament at all," he said. "We focused on each opponent like it was the most important game of the year. And we beat some really good teams along the way."

Hornell dominated Cheektowaga and Syracuse Westhill before facing a tough battle with Nanuet. The difference in the game was that Hornell scored a 2-point conversion after each of their TDs.

Running back Austin Dwyer rushed 35 times for 169 yards and was selected the game's MVP. Dwyer set the

Section 5 single-season rushing record with 2,886 yards, the 6th-best single-season total in NYS history.

Sophomore QB Dominic Scavo (6-3, 205) also had a superb season in just his second year of organized football.

"Dominic missed his 9th-grade season," Mastin said. "He injured his back during baseball and had to have surgery. This was just his second year of organized football."

When Mastin was handed the championship plaque, he immediately thought of all the students that have

played for him.

"We've had so many tremendous kids go through our program," Mastin said. "We've had some players go a long way but not get there. This was for them, too."

Almost by accident, Mastin landed at Hornell before the start of the 1983 season.

"It was a freak thing," Mastin said. "We were visiting my parents in Geneseo one weekend. I opened the paper and saw that the Hornell job had come open. I called on Monday and the AD asked me to apply."

Despite the fact that Hornell had posted just one winning season in 20 years, Mastin came away from his interview encouraged.

"I really wanted to go there after I interviewed," Mastin said. "It seemed like a place where they wanted to have a good football program."

Mastin had already proven he could build a good football team. He got his first head coaching job at Cameron County High School in Pennsylvania. The school had posted a 20-game losing streak when Mastin arrived in 1979. In four seasons, Cameron County posted a record of 19-19-2.

Mastin, who is well-known as obsessive about organization and attention to details, has been at Hornell for 26 years now.

In addition to coaching the football team, Mastin started as an Elementary school teacher before taking a position as a Guidance Counselor at the high school. He has also worked as the Athletic Director and is now the Chief Information Officer, working with all the student data in the school's computer system.

"Every one of those jobs is detail-oriented," he said. "I had to be organized to keep up."

This past season, when the Raiders beat Wayland-Cohocton 42-6 in Week 6, Mastin became the all-time

that these kids were very committed to winning this season. I decided to come back and I have intentions of coaching again next season."

And, next season, Hornell will be loaded again. The Raiders will have 7 starters back on defense and 6 on offense. The JV team finished 8-0.

"These kids are not just quality players," Mastin said, "but they are good people and I like being around them."

Mastin says that this season was about far more than winning a state title.

"I liked the ride as much as I liked the destination," Mastin said. "I liked all the practices with these kids. The meetings, the games. After we had won the championship, I felt a sense of relief and a real sense of accomplishment. I was very proud of all of us because

wins leader in Section 5 passing longtime Fairport coach Don Santini, who retired with 206 wins.

Mastin now has 214 wins in his career, 18th in New York State history, and says that he was honored when he passed both Canandaigua's Mike Foster (199 wins) last year and Santini this season.

"I'm not big on numbers," Mastin said. "I respect Don Santini and Mike Foster so much as coaches and people. As far as I'm concerned, the rest of us will be chasing them forever. I'm humbled to be in the same area with them."

Surprisingly, Mastin almost never got the chance to catch Santini or win a state title this season. He was seriously considering retirement from the sidelines after the 2008 season.

"I really gave a lot of thought to getting out," Mastin said. "I had a meeting with the team two days after the season ended. But I saw

this is something we did together.”

But, this season, Mastin and his family faced an opponent that was far tougher than anything on the field. Just two weeks before the season, Mastin’s wife of 32 years, Cheryl, was diagnosed with cancer. The Mastin’s have already been through this once before, when Cheryl underwent chemotherapy in 1999.

“It’s been a challenging fall,” Mastin said. “I wasn’t in a position to neglect either one. I had an obligation to my family and my team.”

Mastin says he dealt with Cheryl’s cancer the same as he dealt with his team.

“We just kept focused on ‘What has to be done today?’” Mastin said. “We had to be organized and take care of details.”

The football coach in a small city is almost a local celebrity. The Mastin’s battle

was followed by most of the City of Hornell this fall.

“She has been a rallying point for a lot of our players,” Mastin said. “She has always been around the program so these kids have known her forever. My daughter is a senior at Hornell so a lot of these guys are her classmates.”

During the championship game at the Carrier Dome, Scavo and Dunn wore pink towels in their waist bands and pink wrist bands. Other players wore pink shoelaces or socks.

“Cancer is nothing you would wish on anybody,” mastin said. “It’s such a challenging disease. Both the physical and the mental stress is intense. Anyone who has dealt with it knows.”

As of now, Cheryl Mastin seems to be recovering.

“She has completed all her treatments and we hope we can move forward now.”

The NYSHSFCA has made a momentous decision and has drastically changed the way the organization communicates to its members.

The NYSHSFCA's official magazine, From The Sidelines, will cease to exist in its printed format.

And in today's world, there is a better, faster and easier way to do it.

And so... the NYSHSFCA will now distribute the Sidelines magazine through the e-mail.

No more waiting for a paper copy to arrive at your mailbox. No more issues lost in the mail.

Simply put, the NYSHSFCA can reach more coaches, reach them faster and more reliably than the old way.

Oh, and it's cheaper besides.

Now, some may lament the loss of the intimate relationship a reader has with his magazine. You can sit anywhere (and as a red-blooded American male, I do mean "anywhere") and read a magazine.

Some people really like the feel of holding a magazine or a newspaper while they read it.

Well... that's changing too.

With laptops becoming smaller and lighter all the time, it gets easier and easier to carry one around.

And with wireless networks being installed everywhere from college campuses to McDonald's, it's getting easier and easier to get on-line and check your e-mail.

Heck, most high school kids can now read and send e-mail over their phone.

So why is the Coaches Association spending money to accomplish the same thing?

The fact is, when human beings resist change, the only thing they stop is their ability to shape the change to their liking.

In other words, get used to it.

If still want to read the

paper version (or give a paper version to someone else) simply print out the pages you want.

Also, the Sidelines will now be smaller and distributed more often.

Such a change will allow the NYSHSFCA to communicate with the membership more often. And with the world now "tweeting" small pieces of information almost constantly, making your membership wait three months for a magazine is a deadly flaw for any organization.

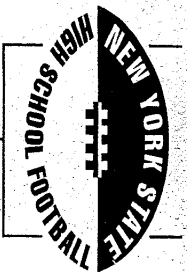
Quite simply, your membership base needs to hear from you more often than five times a year.

So, I hope you continue to read and enjoy the Sidelines.

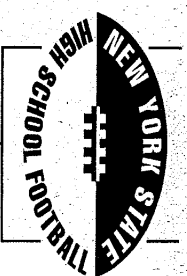
